It is imperative for families with a student who is ID, ED, and AU to register for Medicaid Waiver Programs through Central County Services. Current waiting lists are between 5 years and 15 years long.

**Transition** services are activities that prepare students with disabilities to move from school to post-school life. The activities must be based on the student's needs, preferences, and interests, and shall include needed activities in instruction and related services.
