Founder Bill Milliken began CIS in New York City in the 1970s. He came up with the idea of bringing community resources inside public schools - where they are accessible, coordinated and accountable. Young people thrive when adults care about them on a one-to-one level, and when they also have a sense of belonging to a caring community."
