


CONTRACTS

The social contract is an agreement about how we will treat each other.



We answered 4 questions to create it.

- How do you want to be treated by me?
- How do you want to treat each other?
- How do you think I want to be treated by you?
- How do we want to treat each other when there is conflict?

Let's review our Hand Signs.

Time out



Signal I (the teacher) use to get your attention.

You should pause any discussion/ movement and look at me (the teacher).

Check



Signal you (the students) use with each other to remind each other of the social contract.

Point to where the social contract is posted in the classroom.

<u>Foul</u>



Signal anyone can make to express that the social contract has been violated.

The person who violated the contract gives 2 affirmations to the signaler.

Scenario Time

In your groups, read your scenario and discuss:

- What needs to change in order for the social contract to be followed?
- What could you do as a student in this situation?
- What would happen if you did nothing?

In your groups, read your scenario and discuss:

Derek is early to class every day, but since he comes there from lunch, he needs to go to the bathroom during class time. He asks to go to the bathroom about 20 minutes into class pretty much every day. As a result, he misses a lot of instructional time because he is gone for 10 to 15 minutes each time.

In your groups, read your scenario and discuss:

One day, the teacher is asking the class some review questions to help them process a lesson. Amy raises her hand and when the teacher calls on her she answers with a silly, off-topic answer that makes the whole class laugh.

In your groups, read your scenario and discuss:

Emilio often looks bored in class, and today, like many days, he lays his head down on his desk and closes his eyes. When the teacher tries to wake him, Emilio briefly raises his head. However, he drops it back down the minute the teacher walks away.

In your groups, read your scenario and discuss:

While you are in stations, you notice Lily make comments to James, joking about his appearance and the way that he speaks. She implies that he is not very smart. James laughs it off and tries to focus on his work, but Lily keeps making comments.

In your groups, read your scenario and discuss:

As you are working in groups, Roderick begins using profanity to address other members of the group. Not long after, Jenna joins in using coarse language.

Remember

We have all agreed to treat each other according to the social contract. We can all hold each other accountable.

And the best part is, if you help each other, and I don't have to get involved, there will be no consequences.
