## Exams for Acceleration (EFA)

Exams for Acceleration are offered online to students enrolled in grades 6-12 in the 20232024 school year who request to demonstrate proficiency in a grade level or course in which they have not previously been enrolled.

These exams are for students with NO PRIOR INSTRUCTION.

For grades 6-8, four exams must be taken for acceleration:

- Math
- Science
- Social Studies
- Language Arts

In order to accelerate a grade level, the student must take and pass each exam with an $80 \%$ or higher before the start of the school year for which acceleration is desired.

Students may only accelerate one grade level per academic year.

For grades $9-12$, each exam is worth $1 / 2$ credit. In order to receive one full credit, 2 exams must be taken.

It is recommended that students requesting acceleration have an overall average of $90 \%$ or higher in their core courses.

For grades 6-12, the campus designee must recommend that the student be accelerated. Campus recommendation must be supported by multiple data sources.

Parents can pursue having their student tested through UT High School directly if the campus does not endorse a testing referral or if parents want testing outside of our district testing windows.

## Credit by Exams (CBE) Credit Recovery

Credit by Examinations are offered to students in grades 6-12 who have failed to satisfactorily complete a course or grade level in which they were previously enrolled. The following criteria must be met:

- Previous grade for subject to be tested must be no lower than 60.
- Courses for which tests are to be taken must have been attempted within the school year immediately preceding the test date.

For grades 6-8, to receive credit for an entire grade level that was previously failed, the student must score $70 \%$ or higher on each of four tests in language arts, math, science and social studies.

For grades 9-12, students only take the semester ( $1 / 2$ credit) of the course they failed.

To receive credit for a course/grade that was failed, the student must score at least a 70\% on the test(s) taken.
