Clarification on Professional Services (6219) versus Consultants (6291) versus Misc. Services (6299)

Professional Services (6219)

Should only be used for Professional Services as defined by TX Government Code. These professionals are required to be licensed by or registered with the state:

- ✓ Architecture
- ✓ Optometry
- ✓ Landscape Architecture
- ✓ Land Surveying
- ✓ Professional Engineering
- ✓ Real Estate Appraising
- ✓ Medicine
- ✓ Professional Nursing
- ✓ Accounting (non audit)

<u>6291</u>—Campuses as well as most departments RARELY use a consultant as defined by TEA.</u> A true consultant (object 6291) performs research and analysis on a specific issue or problem found within KISD—the district as a whole, a specific department, or a campus—on his/her own or with a team. The consultant will present the results of the research and analysis as well as any suggestions for improvement to administration, but not to the district, campus, grade, department as a whole.

<u>6299</u>—If you are paying someone to present information during an organized activity (*professional development training, instructional presentation for the students, grade-level meetings, etc.*) you are paying for a Miscellaneous Service and that should be charged to object 6299.
