



# Are you ready for life after high school?

**College Readiness:** College ready students demonstrate proficiency in English and Math. There are several ways to do this. Note: College-ready students apply for college(s) and complete their FAFSA prior to high school graduation.

## 1. Pass a college entrance exam in ELA/Reading, Writing and Math.

### ELA/Reading & Writing:

- TSIA 2.0 score 945-990 on the ELAR College Readiness Classification (CRC) and a score of at least 5 on the Essay Test
- TSIA Reading score of 351 AND Writing score of 340 or higher and 4+ on essay or Writing score below 340 with 5+ on essay and a 4+ on ABE, or
- SAT EBRW score of 480 or higher
- ACT Composite score of 23, AND English score of 19 or higher, or
- Successful completion of College Prep English Course

### Math:

- TSIA 2.0 score 950-990 on the Mathematics College Readiness Classification
- TSIA Math score 350 or higher, or
- SAT Math score of 530 or higher, or
- ACT Composite score of 23, AND Math score of 19 or higher, or
- Successful completion of College Prep Math course

## 2. Complete dual credit coursework.

- English (3 college credit hours), or
- Math (3 college credit hours), or
- Other Dual Credit Coursework (9 college credit hours)

## 3. Pass an Advanced Placement (AP) - Score 3 or higher on AP

A graduate who is identified as receiving special education services during the year of graduation and whose graduation plan is identified as Distinguished Achievement Plan (DAP), Foundation High School Plan with Endorsement (FHSP-E), or Foundation High School Plan with a Distinguished Level of Achievement (FHSP-DLA) also meets the College, Career and Military Readiness (CCMR) indicator.

**Career & Military Readiness:** Career and military ready students have prepared themselves to begin their first career upon graduation from high school. There are several different ways to do this.

1. Earn an industry certification from the state-approved list of certifications.
2. Complete a Career & Technical Education Program of Study aligned with the programs of study published by TEA.
3. Complete your IEP goals and demonstrate workforce readiness skills, or
4. Enlist in the U.S. Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, Marines, or Texas National Guard. Military-ready students complete the following during high school:
  - Take the ASVAB, and earn a minimum overall score of 31 or higher
  - Meet with recruiters to explore career options, and
  - Visit MEPS for a physical and in-processing, and take a sworn oath to serve and sign a contract

**Note:** Military-ready student will receive a red, white, and blue cord to wear for graduation to signify their enlistment and commitment to military service. Cords are provided through the CCMR department.

**Note:** You can meet the qualifying standard in English and Math in one assessment (TSIA2.0, TSIA, SAT, or ACT).

Meeting the qualifying standard for English in one assessment and the qualifying standard for Math in a different assessment will also demonstrate college readiness.
