





Once an individual is determined eligible for services, these services may be obtained through the Central Counties Services Local Authority. The following interventions or supports are expected to help the person participate better in community activities.

Service Coordination

Case management activities such as linking to services, assessment, service planning and monitoring.

Continuity of Service

Assistance in coordinating an uninterrupted flow of services for people seeking placement to and from state and community Medicaid facilities.

Behavioral Supports

Behavior management or counseling techniques designed to increase adaptive behaviors or decrease inappropriate behaviors.

Community Supports

Provides community inclusion training, assistance and supports to individuals including such training as daily living skills, money managements, grocery shopping, transportation to community activities, training in rights and advocacy, etc.

Employment Assistance

Services to assist the person to locate paid employment in the community. These include identification of job preferences, job skills, work requirements and work conditions.

Supported Employment

Training to maintain the person's employment by providing ongoing supports including the services of a professional job coach.

Vocational Training

Training activities in a variety of settings to enable a person to obtain employment. Examples of these services are training the person to complete a resume and to participate in a job interview.

Nursing Care

Treatment and monitoring of health care procedures prescribed by physician or medical practitioner. Includes testing for diabetes, monitoring of hypertension, and supervision of medication

Day Habilitation

Day programs provided away from the person's home to help the person develop or refine skills necessary to live or work in the community. This is normally done in a group setting. The training includes socializations skills, task oriented skills, and education on consumer rights.

Respite Care

Planned or emergency short term relief services for the person's caregiver.

Central Counties Services also has:

 Home and Community-based Services (HCS) Medicaid waiver program





In order to obtain intellectual disability services from the Local Authority or Central Counties Services Authority, the person must have a diagnosis of one or more of the following:

- · Intellectual Disability
- Pervasive Developmental Disorder
- Autism
- Related conditions (ICD-9 codes)
- or Nursing facility resident eligible for specialized mental retardation services

Diagnosis is determined by formal testing called a Determination of Intellectual Disability (DID) administered or endorsed by a Certified Associate Psychologist employed by the Local Authority.
