Special Performances & Events

KISD Visual Arts Show - Each year for one week around March 1st

Visual Art Scholastic Event (VASE) - High school students are provided the opportunity to bring artworks created in their art classes to a regional event where they are interviewed by a certified juror who evaluates their work based on a standards based rubric and their understanding of the art processes involved in the development of their artwork. Students selected advance to the state contest in April.

Dance & Auxiliary Groups (High School only) - Drill team and color guard auxiliary groups support the marching bands in the fall, and may be seen at football games and local parades. In the spring, they become separate organizations, performing in various dance and winter guard contests at the state and national level.

Elementary Summer Musical - Auditions are held each May and performances are given at the end of June at the Ellison High School auditorium.





Elementary Festival of Choirs - Three clusters of 5 schools each perform at one of the high school auditoriums each year.

Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra - Student concerts and public performances, one with the high school advanced singers performing a major choral work with the orchestra.

KISD Theatre Arts Festival - Provides secondary theatre students an opportunity to perform their productions in a theatre setting for other theatre students and parents appreciative of the performances.

Shakespeare Theatre Camp (STC) - Provides students ages 12-16 an opportunity to participate in an interdisciplinary program integrating Shakespearian literature with theatre arts. Classes in acting, movement and scene study are offered at this one-week summer camp in June.
