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# What is the MYP Programme?

The MYP, or Middle Years Programme, is a part of the **International Baccalaureate Programme**. The IB Programme is a nonprofit educational foundation that was founded in 1968. The International Baccalaureate Programme:

- Provides common curriculum and university entry credentials for geographically mobile students
- Relates content of the classroom to the outside world
- Promotes international thinking, intellectual rigor, high academic standards, and responsible citizens.

## Middle Years Programme

MYP focuses on values, intellectual development, international awareness, and social responsibility. MYP curriculum is a rigorous, structured curriculum developed by teachers that uses the application of problem-solving skills, hands-on activities, and innovative learning techniques. Students in the MYP are provided with meaningful learning experiences through interdisciplinary lessons with real-world connections and are motivated to reflect on their learning.
